Weston Stroud called the meeting to order at 9:15 a.m.

2. Approval of Minutes

A 02-20-2024 Meeting Minutes

On motion of Rob Ryals, seconded by Greg Brown (in for Jeff Ruggieri), and passed unanimously, the minutes from February 20, 2024, were approved.

3. Old Business

A Update on Safe Streets for All Grant

Weston Stroud reported that grants are on hold due to White House administration orders. He discussed GDOT Projects for Gray Highway sidewalks and multi-use access trails.

4. New Business

Rob Ryles reported on the Vineville reversible center lane system and that GDOT is conducting traffic studies now to replace them.

Weston reported that the SDK Software Agreement is up for renewal in April 2025. He suggested that it should be presented to PSRB during the

March meeting. It will cost \$46,000.00 for a 2-year agreement, he can send out the quote to the Board for review prior to the next meeting. He also informed the board that there will be 15 new bus stop shelters installed throughout Macon. The exact locations are unknown at this time.

John Hayes reported that the Blind Academy has an issue with no sidewalks in the area. There are no funds available at this time, but he is working on a scope for the project. He reported that he hired a surveyor to do a survey on Jeffersonville Road for sidewalks and lighting. John is working on prioritizing the repair of lights after a storm. He plans to work with Georgia Power on the project.

The Board will apply for the Governor's Highway Safety Grant again. The submission is due in May.

Rachel Umana reported that Bike Walk Macon Inc. is making a donation to Macon-bibb County. The final approval of acceptance will be at the Commission meeting tonight. The resolution reads in part: *A Resolution of the Macon-Bibb County Commission to authorize the acceptance of eleven (11) bike racks and eleven (11) simme seats as a donation to Macon-Bibb County from Bike Walk Macon, Inc., to be installed at various locations in downtown Macon.*
